Westmead Hospital is part of one of the largest health, education and medical research precincts in NSW and Australia. The Westmead Hospital is a flagship facility for NSW which plays a key role in meeting the health service needs of the people of Western Sydney, in addition to providing major tertiary and quaternary services for NSW.

The Westmead Hospital Redevelopment represents a fundamental opportunity to establish the future service and capital development platform for the Hospital to meet increasing health care needs over the long term. Key service priorities for the Redevelopment are likely to include:

- Emergency department and associated services
- Operating theatres including state of the art intra-operative theatres
- Major diagnostics and ambulatory services
- Establishment of comprehensive care centres for cardiology, respiratory, and gastroenterology
- Establishment of a new and contemporary Institute for Clinical Pathology and Medical Research.
- Major early / enabling works package including engineering services upgrades.
